Café Tacuba


Sunday August 25, 2019 8:00pm



Café Tacvba is widely recognized as the leading alternative rock band in Mexico and one of the most influential alternative groups from Latin America, leading a nonconformist music movement with its mix of elements such as rock, indigenous folk, electronic music and punk.

Celebrating their 30th anniversary, Café Tacvba continues to expand a massive audience of devoted fans throughout the Americas, Europe and beyond. They have won multiple Latin Grammys and one Grammy award. Their album "Re", was named as the "Latin rock album number one of all time" in 2013 (Rolling Stone).

Beginning in the 80s, as a garage band of graphic design students in the Satélite neighborhood, in Mexico City, it took the name of Café Tacuba (later changed to Cafe Tacvba) in 1989, when the lineup solidified with Rubén Albarrán on vocals and guitars, guitarist José Alfredo Rangel (Joselo), bassist Enrique Rangel (Quique), and keyboardist Emmanuel del Real (Meme).





Flor de Toloache

Latin Grammy® winning, New York-based all-female ensemble and beloved press darlings, Flor de Toloache continue to win the hearts of both progressive and traditional mariachi music fans alike through their distinct artistic vision and sophisticated, enlightened interpretation of traditional mariachi instruments. The female quartet's diverse ethnicities and musical backgrounds have also transcended culture and gender by forging new paths. Like the legendary Love Potion the Toloache flower is used for in Mexico, the ladies of Flor de Toloache cast a spell over their audiences with soaring vocals and physical elegance. The group is led by coband directors Mireya I. Ramos on violin and Shae Fiol on vihuela. Together, they have graced international stages from Chenai, India to Paris, France and have extensively toured the U.S. as supporting act for Dan Auerbach of The Black Keys' new project The Arcs, as well as Cafe Tacvba, La Santa Cecilia, and Natalia Lafourcade.

He is the recipient of virtually every honor in broadcast journalism, including numerous Emmy Awards, several Peabody Awards and the 2012 Edward R. Murrow Lifetime Achievement Award.

Rather's best-selling book of original essays, What Unites Us: Reflections on Patriotism takes on the current toxic political atmosphere and polarized opinions with a hopeful reminder of the core ideals that all Americans share. It also incorporates Rather's decades of experience as a living witness to history, covering the biggest events and news stories of our times.



Shannon Wild, Photographer & Cinematographer



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
Mystery Science Theater 3000 Live

This production ties together a living lineage of music and culture that includes traditional gospel, modern gospel, classical, jazz, Broadway and spirituals.


Drum Tao 2020
